

1. ANELLO VERDE OF RIMINI CYCLE PATH

Among the paths of the Bicipolitana, the Anello Verde Cycle Path crosses parks and tree-lined avenues and leads from Marina centre (Piazzale Kennedy), to the modern Palacongressi where important conferences and exhibitions take place.

The cycle path runs along the Cervi Park and runs along the ancient city walls, creating a convenient link between the sea area of the hotels and the historic centre.

2. LUNGOMARE CYCLE PATH

This cycle path runs along the promenade from the port of Rimini to the port of Cattolica, for a length of 21 Km. It is a very nice and pleasant route as it has a direct view of the sea. Along the way there are flower beds with Mediterranean essences, such as rosemary, and 'pit stop' columns with information on routes and accessories for bicycle care.

3. OVERVIEW OF SAN BARTOLO

La Panoramica in the Regional Park of San Bartolo is a 25 km cycle path that winds on asphalt, from Gabicce Monte to Pesaro.

With soft curves and a continuous "eat and drink" that in cycling jargon indicate the ups and downs, the road preserves a double charm, rural and coastal at the same time. The view ranges from one side of the Adriatic seen from the top; from the other on hills planted with vines, willow and oaks.

4. VAL MARECCHIA CYCLE PATH

The route runs along the pedestrian cycle of Val Marecchia, starting from the Marecchia Park XXV Aprile to Ponte Verucchio.

Once through the park, you reach the embankment of the river Marecchia where the bike path on a dirt track begins. These paths are easily accessible even by the less experienced, but we recommend the use of mountain bikes. This itinerary goes inland and in its evocative landscapes following the course of the Marecchia river, then reaching the public park of Villa Verucchio and the bridge over Marecchia near the provincial road 14.

5. VALCONCA CYCLE PATH

Cycling in the Valconca, a friend of the environment par excellence, is a priceless experience. Reaching the Valconca is not complicated, the main indication is the one that leads us following the course of the river Conca from the sea, located territorially between Cattolica and Misano Adriatico, and then climb up to 1400 meters of Mount Carpegna, where the river starts its path downstream.
