Rimini

(10.9 km from Hotel Ambasciatori)

In addition to the beaches and nightlife, there are several architectural and cultural works that fill the historic centre of Rimini.

The walk starts from the beautiful "Parco del Mare", recently redeveloped with green areas, bike paths, pedestrian and islands equipped for fitness.

In the historic centre stands the Arch of Augustus, the imposing Roman monument, erected by Emperor Augustus in 27 A.C, which was the gateway to the historic centre from the ancient Via Flaminia. The main street is Corso d'Augusto, characterized by several shops and clubs, which begins at the Arch of Augustus and arrives directly at the Tiberius Bridge, also of Roman times.

Along the Corso you arrive in Piazza Tre Martiri, a place dedicated to the memory of three young people, executed during the Second World War.

The square houses the bronze statue of Julius Caesar, a marble inscription of the '500, the small octagonal Temple in honor of Saint Antonio of Padova and the sixteenth-century Clock Tower.

In the centre you can also visit the Duomo of Rimini and in Piazza Cavour which is the main meeting place of the city there are several buildings: the Palazzo dell'Arengo, the Palazzo del Podestà, the neoclassical Teatro Galli, and the Vecchia Pescheria. In Piazza Malatesta, there is also Castel Sismondo which was the imposing military fortress of the noble Sigismondo Pandolfo Malatesta, lord of Rimini and Fano, and was built in the '400 by the same owner in collaboration with famous architects such as Filippo Brunelleschi.

Sant'Arcangelo di Romagna, located in the Province of Rimini, is a charming village that offers an authentic atmosphere and a rich historical heritage. You can walk through its medieval streets, taste the typical local products and participate to the traditional festivals that animate the village.

The village of Pennabilli is located between two rocky peaks. Of great interest and certainly worth a visit is the museum system, which consists of: Mateureka museum of calculus, dedicated to mathematics and computer science, the Diocesan Museum A. Bergamaschi housed in Palazzo Bocchi.

The town is also known as the "cradle of the Malatesta" because here began the power of the Malatesta, by Giovanni della Penna dei Billi called precisely the Malatesta. Rich finds have been brought to light by the necropolis excavated around the town, now exposed in the Civic Archaeological Museum.

Poggio Torriana

(38 km from Hotel Ambasciatori)

Born from the fusion of Poggio Berni and Torriana, history has left many signs of the past on this territory: in Poggio Berni, the Palazzo Marcosanti is one of the best preserved fortresses of the Signoria dei Malatesta; in Torriana, the fifteenth-century Malatesta Fortress. The village of Poggio Torriana holds the secret of a legend. In its hamlet of Montebello stands a castle that is said to be inhabited by the ghost of Azzurrina.

(75 km from Hotel Ambasciatori)

The historic centre of Ravenna revolves around its main square, Piazza del Popolo, a meeting point for its citizens. Tourists from all over Italy and from all over the world come to visit Ravenna because in this city there is one of the most famous funerary tombs, that of Dante Alighieri.

San Marino

(26 km from Hotel Ambasciatori)

San Marino is the capital of the Republic of San Marino, a small independent town surrounded by Italian territory. Located on top of Mount Titano, it is known for its old medieval town and cobbled streets. On the top of the mountain, a path connects 3 towers, part of the ancient defensive system of the city.

It is a village closed by high walls with access protected by a tower with medieval door, a village intact in its structure, which has been carefully restored, with the aim of reviving the country in a perspective of hospitality, tourism and culture.

San Giovanni in Marignano is a charming village that combines history and nature. You can visit the charming Church of San Giovanni Battista, with its ancient frescoes, and walk along its characteristic streets. The surrounding nature offers the possibility of hiking and regenerating walks.

In the fortress of Montefiore, you can admire an incredible view that reaches the sea.

Mondaino

(23 km from Hotel Ambasciatori)

In Mondaino you can admire a magnificent panorama, an imposing Rocca and its particular semicircular square, theatre of the challenges of the Palio del Daino.

Saludecio

(20 km from Hotel Ambasciatori)

Saludecio has a particularly characteristic historic centre thanks to the many murals that color the facades of the houses.

In addition to its historical and natural treasures the Valconca also preserves a jewel to visit: the Natural Reserve and the Onferno Caves - from 2023 UNESCO World Heritage, a karst complex considered among the most important in Italy among the gypsum caves, carved into the rock by a stream over millennia.

Gradara

(14 km from Hotel Ambasciatori)

In the hinterland of the Marchigiano-romagnola Riviera, not far from the sea, Gradara is the village where the love story between Paolo and Francesca was consumed.

Known especially for its historic Rocca Malatestiana, which together with its fortified village and its walls is a characteristic example of medieval architecture.

Urbino

(56 km from Hotel Ambasciatori)

It was one of the most important centres of the Italian Renaissance, of which it fully preserves the architectural heritage. Since 1998 its historic centre is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Urbino is home to one of the greatest Renaissance painters and architects, Raffaello Sanzio. Some of his works, along with those of Tiziano and Piero della Francesca, are housed in the Galleria Nazionale delle Marche which is located inside the Palazzo Ducale, symbol of Renaissance art wanted by Federico da Montefeltro, great protagonist of his era.

Pesaro

Since 2005 it has been Blue Flag for sandy beaches, clean water and quality of hospitality. A unique coastline that stretches for 7 km at the slopes of the hills of San Bartolo and Ardizio, the two headlands that are the cradle to the city. The historical centre of the city still maintains the subdivision between cardo and decumanus of Roman age and is rich of ancient churches, museums, libraries, historical palaces and archaeological sites, all to discover.

UNESCO Creative City of Music since 2017 and Italian Capital of Culture 2024 offers a varied program of events, exhibitions, shows all year round, as well as major international summer events, such as the Rossini Opera Festival and the Mostra Internazionale del Nuovo Cinema.

San Bartolo Natural Park

(14 km from Hotel Ambasciatori)

Mount San Bartolo is the first promontory of the Adriatic coast and from its hills overlooking the sea you can admire a wonderful panorama that ranges from a thousand shades of green, to intense blue. On the rocky spur overlooking the sea are the ancient medieval villages of Fiorenzuola di Focara, one of the most beautiful villages in Italy, and Casteldimezzo.

Land and sea merge in a unique spectacle that is due to the biodiversity of this protected place; a natural reserve where the presence of man with his farms, the cultivation of vines and fruit trees, is in harmony and balance with the environment.
